NEBRASKA BOARD OF NURSING MINUTES OF THE MEETING

November 13, 2025

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the Nebraska Board of Nursing was called to order by Theresa Delahoyde, Board President, at 8:30 a.m., November 13, 2025, at the Best Western Plus Conference Room, 2201 Wildcat Circle, Lincoln NE 68521. Copies of the agenda were emailed to the Board members and to interested parties on November 3, 2025, posted in the east entryway of the Nebraska State Office Building on November 3, 2025, and posted on the Department of Health & Human Services website on November 3, 2025. LICENSURE RECOMMENDATIONS

ANDREW O. GOMEZ - LPN APPLICATION

TEDRA BULLARD (aka TEDRA BEGERON) - LPN PRIVILEGE REINSTATEMENT FROM DISCIPLINE

MOTION: Jordan made the motion, seconded by Motl, to recommend reinstating Tedra Bullard's LPN Privilege to Practice in Nebraska without restrictions. The recommendation for reinstatement is based on positive letters of recommendation and applicant's completion of probation in another jurisdiction.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

MOTION: The Education Committee moved, seconded by Harrison, that the Board approve the report of the survey conducted at Central Community College's PN and ADN programs on September 30, 2025, and October 1, 2025...

<u>NCLEX Reports</u> – Reznicek reported that graduates of Nebraska LPN programs who took NCLEX-PN for the first time during the 3rd Quarter of 2025, had a pass rate of 92.22%. Twelve jurisdictions had higher pass rates than Nebraska. For graduates of Nebraska RN programs, the NCLEX-RN pass rate for first-time candidates during the 3rd Quarter was 89.13%. Thirteen jurisdictions had higher pass rates.

<u>172 NAC 97</u> – Reznicek reviewed the letter from the Governor explaining why he did not approve the revisions to the Regulations Governing Approval of Basic Nursing Programs. One reason cited by the Governor was that requiring schools to have a physical presence in Nebraska would make it harder for Nebraskans to receive training. The Governor also cited the requirement that program directors work onsite for twelve months prior to the opening of a new program as being overly restrictive. Reznicek noted that the twelve-month requirement is in the existing regulations, and the requirement will remain in effect. Reznicek also noted that because the revisions to Chapter 97 were not approved, schools will still be required to submit waiver requests for faculty who do not have master's degrees and preceptors who do not have BSNs.

PRACTICE COMMITTEE

Motl reported that the *Safe Practice: Fitness to Practice* Advisory Opinion is being reviewed by DHHS Legal. At the Practice Committee's last meeting they also reviewed information from a company headquartered in Kansas that specializes in fitness-to-practice evaluations for licensed professionals. Topics the Committee is considering for future advisory opinions include ketamine and IV therapy. Dohrmann noted that the American Association of Nurse Anesthesiology and the American Psychiatric Nurses Association recently issued a joint statement supporting the benefits of intravenous ketamine therapy for psychiatric disorders. Motl noted that an advisory opinion that supports the off-label use of a drug might create problems.

NCSBN UPDATES

Motl reported the enrollment is now open for winter courses offered by the International Center for Regulatory Scholarship (ICRS). The NCSBN Midyear meeting is scheduled for March 17-19, 2026, in Phoenix, Arizona. NCSBN's Discipline Case Management Conference will be held May 27-28, 2026, in Rosemont, Illinois.

LPN 2025 RENEWALS

Oertwich reported that approximately 4,600 LPNs renewed their licenses by the October 31st deadline. There were approximately 5,600 active LPNs when the renewal period opened. Two years prior, in 2023, approximately 4,800 LPNs had renewed their licenses by the deadline. Oertwich noted that the 2025 renewal rate seemed consistent with the decline in LPN numbers in recent years. With nursing programs expanding their LPN programs, she hopes that the number of LPNs will increase in the future.

JOINT BOARD COMMITTEE ON MEDICAL SPAS

Oertwich reported that the Joint Board Committee on Medical Spas is still drafting a statement on pharmaceutical compounding. They would like to develop a statement that is more understandable to health professionals who do not regularly work with pharmacy statutes and regulations.

NEBRASKA CENTER FOR NURSING

Oertwich reported that no appointments have been made to the Nebraska Center for Nursing (NCN) Board.

NOMINATIONS FOR 2026 BOARD OFFICERS

Joyner reported that she received emails from Board members nominating Brenda Smidt for the Board's 2026 President position and nominating Angela Kula and Eric Smidt for the Board's Vice-President position. No nominations were received by email for the Secretary position. Nominations from the floor were requested. No additional nominations were made for the President and Vice-President positions. Kathy Harrison was nominated for the Secretary position and accepted the nomination. Elections for the officer positions will be held during the Board's December meeting.

COMMUNICATION

<u>Nursing News</u> – Oertwich reported that the most recent addition of *Nursing News* is expected to be distributed soon via email. She noted that in compiling the distribution list for the newsletter, staff noticed a number of instances where multiple nurses were using the same email address, and in many cases the email address appeared to belong to a non-nurse staff member at their place of employment. Oertwich said that they will follow up with the identified employers to address potential concerns.

Lefler suggested that a future edition of the newsletter might contain an article on the Nebraska Nurse Honor Guard, which provides tributes at the memorial services of deceased nurses or living tributes to retired nurses who are 80 years old or older.

<u>Transfer of APRN Board Duties to BON</u> – Oertwich reported that the APRN Board meeting scheduled for October 30th needed to be rescheduled due to lack of quorum. She also reported that she and Joyner will visit the Nebraska Department of Water, Energy, and Environment's Hearing Office in north Lincoln to see if it will be suitable for meetings after the two boards are combined. The Board's current meeting location is not big enough for the expanded Board.

<u>Staff Updates</u> – Oertwich reported that Dohrmann has oriented to the Practice Consultant position with impressive speed. There is currently a vacancy for the Nursing Support Supervisor position, which oversees nurse aide and medication aide registration. The job opening has not been published yet.

PUBLIC COMMENT

The floor was opened to comments from the public. No comments were received.
