

# General Event Report (GER) Introduction Aged and Disabled and Traumatic Brain Injury Waivers

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#### What is the Aged and Disabled (AD) Waiver?

- A program to help eligible individuals receive services in the community rather than a nursing facility.
- Points of eligibility include:
  - Actively receiving Nebraska Medicaid;
  - Disabled per Social Security criteria or over the age of 65 years old;
  - Meeting Nursing Facility Level of Care criteria;
  - Need for waiver services; and
  - Working with a Service Coordinator to identify services to meet identified needs through informal support or paid enrolled providers.

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### What is the Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) Waiver?

- A program to help eligible individuals receive services in the community rather than a nursing facility.
- Points of eligibility include:
  - Actively receiving Nebraska Medicaid;
  - Disabled per Social Security criteria and having a TBI diagnosis;
  - Meeting Nursing Facility Level of Care criteria;
  - Need for waiver services; and
  - Working with a Service Coordinator to identify services to meet identified needs through informal support or paid enrolled providers.

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#### **Defining AD and TBI Providers**

- Agency Providers Company enrolled as a Medicaid provider to provide chosen AD Waiver service(s). The agency is responsible for hiring and supervising employees.
- Independent Providers Person enrolled as a Medicaid provider and works for the individual receiving AD Waiver services. The AD Waiver participant is responsible for hiring and supervising services and works with their Service Coordination to assist with the process.
- Assisted Living Facility Facility where an AD or TBI Waiver participant lives in their own apartment within the facility while receiving a range of support services in a home-like environment.

## What is a General Event Report (GER)?

- General Event Report (GER) is the form name in Therap.
- The GER is a way to document, track, and investigate reportable incidents, which can include injury, medication error, restraint, or death.
- This process assures reportable incidents are filed, investigated in a timely fashion, and analyzed to develop strategies to reduce risk and future occurrences of similar risks.

When an incident involves suspected or alleged abuse, neglect, or exploitation, the provider **must** immediately report the incident to law enforcement or the DHHS Children and Family Services Abuse/Neglect Hotline at: 1-800-652-1999



## Why the process change?

- This summer the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)
  released the HCBS Quality Measure Set, which directs the State
  demonstrate on an ongoing basis, that it identifies, addresses and
  seeks to prevent instances of abuse, neglect, exploitation, and
  unexplained death.
- DDD is committed to providing the best services and care possible to our waiver participants.
- DDD, with direction from CMS, is developing a comprehensive critical incident management process to ensure our participants' safety and quality of life.

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### What is Reportable?

- DDD defines reportable incidents as any incident, injury, or illness to the participant.
- This includes, but is not limited to:
  - Events related to allegation, suspicion, or actual events of abuse, neglect, or exploitation of a child or a vulnerable adult;
  - Prohibited Practices;
  - Fatal 5;
  - Death;
  - Physical Injury;

- Unplanned Medical Visits;
- Medication Errors;
- Missing Person(s);
- Communicable Diseases; and
- Infestations.



## **General Event Report Process**

Identify incident occurred and triage as needed





Report incident to APS/CPS when required Complete GER in Therap



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Incidents tracked and trended for DHHS







### What do providers need to know today?

- Training on incident process will be offered by Liberty Healthcare.
- Training will also be provided by Therap on how to enter GERs.
- More information on these trainings soon.
- Currently Liberty and DDD are working with a GER pilot group, which started in July 2022.


