Comprehensive Developmental Disabilities (CDD) Waiver

WHAT IS THE COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY (CDD) WAIVER?

The CDD Waiver provides services to help people of all ages who have developmental disabilities. These services are intended to maximize independence as participants live, work and socialize in their communities.



WHAT DO CDD WAIVER SERVICES INCLUDE?

In general, CDD Waiver services include:

- Assistive Technology;
- Day Services;
- Home and Vehicle Modifications;
- Personal Emergency Response System (PERS);
- Residential Services; and
- Respite.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE CDD WAIVER?

To be eligible for the CDD Waiver, a participant must have a developmental disability, be eligible for Medicaid, and meet the level of care for an Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID).
