

# Agency Human and Legal Rights Committee (HLRC) Reviews and the Human and Legal Rights Advisory Committee (HLRAC) Role



## Purpose of the HLRAC

The HLRAC is an advisory committee that helps protect the rights of people receiving DD Waiver Services, promotes best practices for HLRCs, and adds a quality outcome focus. The HLRAC reviews cases, makes recommendations, and shares information with the providers and teams to achieve individually defined quality-of-life outcomes.



## Role of the HLRAC

The HLRAC does not replace agency HLRC committees. The HLRAC reviews specific cases where further review may be needed. Agency committees and ISP teams can also request assistance and review by the HLRAC.



## The HLRAC Membership

The HLRAC will be comprised of up to 15 members with various backgrounds and experience, including but not limited to self-advocates, family members of people with disabilities, Behavioral Health professionals, and advocates.



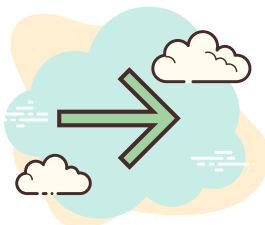
## Pilot Phase

Six providers will be selected to help pilot the review process for 30 days. The pilot phase will help inform the process and updates or changes that need to be made.



## Therap Storage

Agencies will upload their HLRC documents via the Case Note Questionnaire template within Therap. Guidance and training will be provided.
