No Wrong Door Gap Analysis - Karen Houseman

- Medicaid is still studying various No Wrong Door systems
 - We are still in the very preliminary stages at this time.
- Review of the Gaps Analysis
 - o The document is available on the Long Term Care redesign page.
 - The Gap Analysis has a report card on where Nebraska stands within the No Wrong Door process (NWD).
 - o The NWD is not to be just for participants on Medicaid
 - When discussing the graphic on page 8 of who might use the NWD, it was noted Native Americans was not listed and should be included.
- During a discussion in the room it was stated there is discontent from the Disability Community with the Aging and Disability Resource Centers being housed in Area Agencies on Aging as not everyone with a disability is aged.
 - A graphic shared showing one model where the NWD is an umbrella over points of entries with the ADRC as one point of entry or door.
 - If we use this model, there will be many points of entry, both public and private, local community included.
- By utilizing a technology platform with a NWD, it can help collect data which will help get resources to the citizens. Data fuels decisions and the allocation of resources.
- Core functions of a NWD system
 - State governance and administrative functions
 - Public outreach and coordination with key referral sources
 - o Person-centered counseling
 - o Streamlined eligibility for public programs
 - Role of technology
 - o Financing and sustainability.
- We would like to create a **NWD Work Plan Development Committee** with 12 individuals who would represent potential doors.
